The trustees, officers and members of the Salford Brass Mill Project abhor racism and other forms of discrimination. We fully acknowledge the legacy of exploitation which was a major component of the success of the brass industry from the end of the seventeenth century through to the nineteenth century. Rather than minimising or concealing that legacy, we set out to educate and inform all our visitors and stimulate discussion and debate. We do not support violence of any form against people or property.

- Displays in the Mill which explain the West African market for Brass goods;
- Maps and ships inventories which further develop the extent of the notorious "Triangular Slave Trade";
- Including those issues in the guided tours given to visiting individuals and groups (including school and youth groups);
- Encouraging use of the Mill by universities working on linked themes; and
- Including the topic in the various "talks" given to local societies.
