Report for AGM to be held on the 21st June at 7.30pm in the Brass Mill, Saltford

This report covers the period from July 2015 to June 2016.

Chairman's Report

The Brass Mill re-opened to visitors on the 9th May 2015 following its enforced shutdown for essential repairs.

There has been good progress with planned work but problems do remain. The positives are that the full scale mock-up of one battery hammer has been completed and it is now in operation - many thanks to Mike and Judy Reed for their efforts on this. And work is now under way on construction of a replica turntable for loading brassware into the annealing furnace. On the publicity front, Tony Coverdale's programme of talks to local groups has done much to generate interest and we are receiving requests for group visits as a result (more of this in the Secretary's report).

The gardens continue to be maintained to a high standard which is an important visual feature for visitors to Saltford in general and the Shallows in particular.

On the negative side, we are still awaiting action from B&NES on repairs to the Brass Mill roof. The waterwheel saga has moved on; volunteers have constructed a dam across the entrance to the sluice and, the sluice gate having collapsed, have installed a temporary gate in its place. The Project is in negotiations with B&NES over fitting of a permanent replacement sluice gate.

And the Mill suffered one minor flood over the winter, needing little in the way of a clean-up

Progress on 2015/16 Work Programme

- To negotiate a new management agreement between the SBMP and B&NES this no longer seems to be a B&NES priority.
- b) To repair/replace the waterwheel sluice paddle, then continue essential repair and maintenance of the waterwheel starts, sluices and drives.
- c) To produce a full-size replica of a battery hammer complete
- d) To continue promotion of the mill to the public ongoing, good progress
- e) To seek additional volunteers to enable increased opening hours ongoing



Secretary's Report

Talks

The programme of talks and support to off-site events has continued throughout 2015 and 2016. The details of the talks delivered are at the annex. In summary 25 talks were delivered in 2015. 8 have been delivered to-date in 2016 and a further 5 are planned, with 2 further talks planned for 2017. Four talks are available:

- The Early Avon Valley Brass Industry.
- The Later Avon Valley Brass Industry.
- The Restoration of Saltford Brass Mill.
- John Padmore: 18th Century Engineer.

The Widcombe Association, Bath, requested that a talk be prepared on Mills in Widcombe. This talk has been delivered on two occasions with the donations received from the talks being donated to the Saltford Brass Mill Project.


Publications

Links continue to be maintained with heritage groups in the region.

Bath Museums Group

Richard Ross and Tony Coverdale continue to represent the SBMP on the Bath Museums Group.

Twerton and Bath Industrial Heritage

The SBMP has supported two Industrial Heritage Events organised by Bryan Chalker, held at Twerton Football Ground [12 Sept 2015 and 9 Apr 2016]. A further event is planned for the 24 Sept 2016.

Bristol Industrial Archaeology Society (BIAS)

The SBMP maintains its links with the Bristol Industrial Archaeology Society. A group of BIAS members visited the mill in August 2015 and a talk was given to BIAS members in March on the topic of 'John Padmore - Eighteenth Century Engineer'. In April 2016, Tony Coverdale was elected to Chair the Bristol Industrial Archaeology Society.

Avon Industrial Heritage Forum (AIH)

Tony Coverdale represents the SBMP on the Avon Industrial Heritage Forum, formed in 2015 to promote joint-action to research and conserve the industrial heritage of the former county of Avon by establishing a forum to: share information and ideas; agree policy and proposals on matters of mutual interest; support affiliates on planning and conservation matters; and encourage research and publish its findings. The Forum's membership includes the BIAS, the Museum of Bath at Work, The Avon Industrial Buildings Trust, The Bristol Underfall Yard; and South Gloucestershire Mines group.

Avon Local History and Archaeology (ALHA)

Olive Woolcott is an active member of ALHA and represents the SBMP's interests within that association. Tony Coverdale is on the list of available speakers for ALHA members and delivered a talk on the Avon Valley Brass Industry to their annual conference in April, the theme of the conference being 'Vanished Industries - Surviving Skills'. Olive also has access to the ALHA's booklets, a large array of which are sold in the mill on open-days.

Academic Links

The SBMP continues to maintain its links with academic institutions. The SBMP has supported a group of 2nd year students taking the Heritage in Practice module, the theme of the module being to produce a series of riverside walks based upon the 'know your place' mapping project. Discussion are also been held with Richard White, an Associate Lecturer: Creative Media Practice and Heritage at Bath Spa University on a 'walking arts project' he is seeking to undertake on 'the legacies of slave-ownership'.

Research

Research continues into various elements of the Brass Mill and its history.

- The SBMP is constructing a replica of the turntable associated with the annealing furnace, requiring a survey of documentary evidence, investigation of structural evidence and experimentation into construction methods.
- The repair to the waterwheel sluice in increasing out knowledge of the waterpower technology used in the mill.
- Questions raised and information offered by people attending the talks on 'John Padmore - an eighteenth engineer' has stimulated further research, to the extent that it seems likely that there was a John Padmore the Elder and a John Padmore the Younger, active between 1695 and 1735. John Padmore may have been the engineer who converted Saltford Mill for Brass Battery in the 1720s, and certainly copied the technology in Swansea in the 1730s.
